Thank you for your request for information which we received on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> July 2023. I am pleased to confirm the following.

**I'm seeking information on Alzheimer's disease testing. For the last 12 months period, please could you provide:**

**The number of patients tested for Alzheimer's disease via lumbar puncture.  
The number of patients tested for Alzheimer's disease via PET scan.  
The number of patients tested for Alzheimer's disease via SPECT scan.  
The number of patients tested for Alzheimer's disease via MRI or CT scans.**

We don't undertake CT or MRI specifically to test for Alzheimer's. We do perform dementia scans from the Memory Assessment Team. 60 CT scans and 102 MRI scans were performed from the memory clinic between 01.08.22 and 31.07.23. However, we cannot clarify the indications for the scans.
