Thank you for your request for information which we received on Thursday 13 March 2025. I am pleased to confirm the following.

What was the total number of complaints received by the Trust in the financial year between April 2023 - March 2024, and in the financial year from April 2024 to date [example answer: 2,034 between April 2023 - March 2024, 1,999 between 1 April 2024 – present day]

Formal complaints for this period – 177

How many of those complaints related to the uniform, appearance or dress code of staff members (including but not limited to concerns about tattoos, hair colour, piercings, political or religious symbols/statements, hygiene or adherence to uniform policy)? Of those, how many complaints related to nurses. [example answer: 12, of which 3 related to nurses]
