# Federated Data Platform - Summary

The federated data platform programme represents a major strategic shift in the way that the NHS can use data to transform the delivery of healthcare services.



The NHS uses data every day to manage patient care and plan services. Historically, it's been held in different systems that don't speak to each other creating burden for staff and delays to patient care.



The federated data platform is software that will sit across existing systems and connect them.



The federation aspect means that every trust, and ICB will have access to their own version of the data platform, which they will have complete control over.



Each NHS organisation will be the data controller for their federated platform and will make decisions about how their local data is used.



The federated data platform will remove the need to cross reference spreadsheets and paper-based records improve our ability to keep patient information safe.



We have run an independent procurement exercise, done by the NHS, for the NHS.

# FDP will support five use cases...



To deliver against these priorities, the FDP will include these common functionalities:



# Transition will involve moving existing products onto an FDP tenant, while maintaining benefits and seamless use of tools

Transition is necessary to, (1) ensure Trusts can become a part of the FDP, leveraging the platform benefits, and (2) to support organisations on how to best utilise the FDP and realise additional benefits



Our ambition is for the length of transition to span until June 2024 overall, however Trusts will be transitioned in waves, to reduce the overall impact to your organisation.



During this period, the FDP Central Programme team will engage regularly with your organisation – this will include group forums and individual direct conversations with Trusts to ensure full support. Trusts will incur no costs during transition.



Engagement activities from a Trust perspective during transition should include attendance to forums where relevant, internal engagement / preparations, work with on ground technical teams to test and assure new products.



The programme has set up arrangements to ensure benefits and products are minimally impacted. Decommission will also only occur once the new solution is working, to ensure transition runs smoothly.

## How you can support the transition

- Agree preferred ways of **engagement** between our team and you
- Support our team in **ongoing communication** with your product teams to support our understanding of your product and requirements for transition
- Participate in **supplier onboarding** where needed, such as product demonstrations
- Final **validation of your product(s)** and transition requirements with the supplier
- **UAT and post transition activities** to ensure product functionality

## What we will provide during transition

- Regular engagement sessions with our team to provide:
  - Key updates
  - Upcoming milestones
  - Transition planning / implementation plans
  - Progress updates
- Be your point of contact for local product transition queries

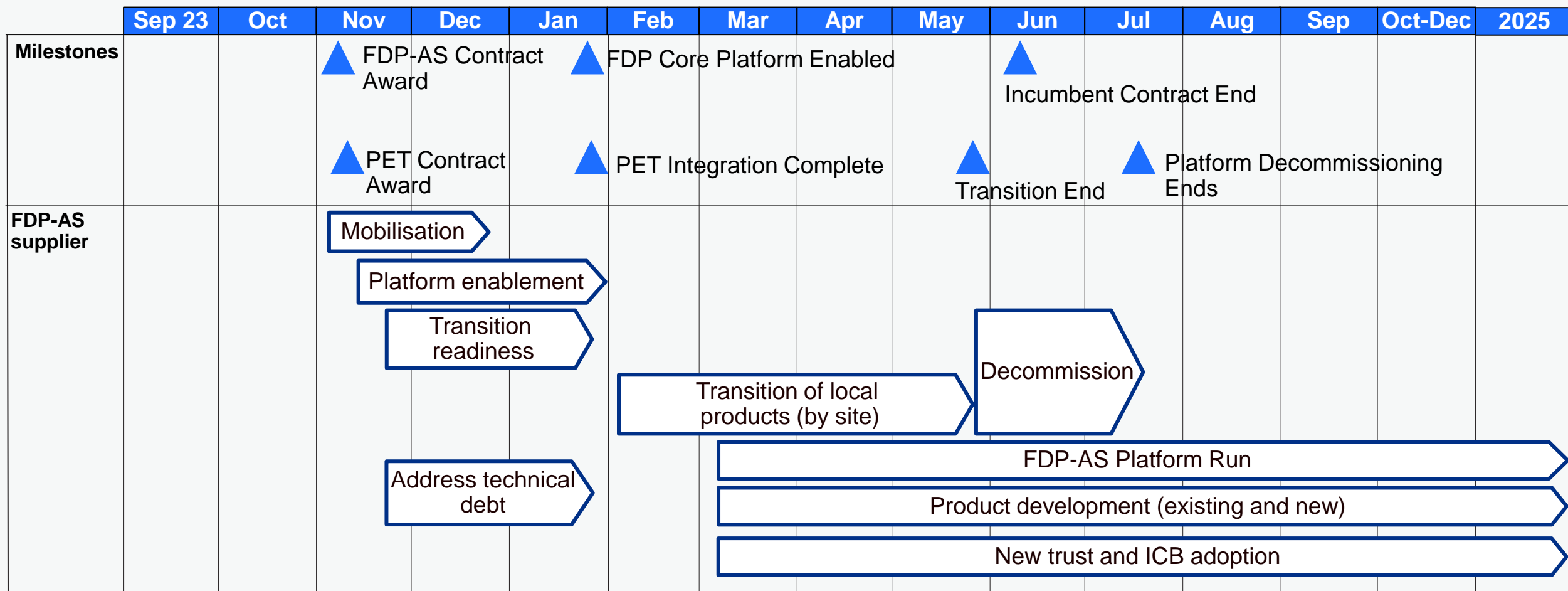
