Request under Freedom of Information Act 2000

Thank you for your request for information which we received on Wednesday 5 March 2025. I am pleased to confirm the following.

Specifically the lab testing method for determining HbA1c for all my tests, including information about the lab equipment and assay (if any), as part of investigating a blood condition I have and its effect on blood test results. Examples include:

Roche cobas c 513 with A1CX3 Tina-quant Hemoglobin A1cDx Gen.3

Siemens Atellica CH HbA1c Assay

Tosoh Automated Glycohemoglobin Analyzer HLC-723G8, software v5.24F, with TSKgel G8 HSi Column, Elution Buffers, and Hemolysis & Wash Solution

MKUH uses the following for HbA1c testing

Analyser: TOSOH G11 Automated HPLC analyser

Method: Non-Porous Cation exchange high performance liquid chromatography

(HPLC)

Sample type: EDTA

The reagents utilised are as follows

- Buffer 1: Low ionic strength buffer. Elutes off weak bound fraction like HbA1a and HbA1b.
- Buffer 2: Elutes off HbF, I-A1c and s-A1c.
- Buffer 2&3 (40:60 Ratio): Elutes HbA
- Buffer 3: Elutes off all remaining fractions
- Haemolysis & Wash: Responsible for haemolysing red cells and release of haemoglobin. Used on board for the dilution of whole blood samples and for manual dilution of small volume samples.
