Request under Freedom of Information Act 2000

Thank you for your request for information which we received on Wednesday 5 February 2025. I am pleased to confirm the following.

For further clarity I would like to inform you that the information I am looking for related to abortion for non-medical (social) reasons. If the trust does not offer this please let me know- I do not require abortion policies and guidance for fetal abnormality or medical reasons.

Alternatively if social abortion is offered and the trust does not have a policy but follow national policy could you please specify what national policy documents the trust follow and specify the following (these questions relate to non-medical (social) abortion only): Does the trust hold any guidance on the following criteria? What methods of abortion are offered? What are the gestational limits for these methods? Is a pre-procedure ultrasound required? How can a person be referred into the service?

Milton Keynes University Hospital Trust does not offer a service for non-medical (social) termination of pregnancy. Any people seeking this service are referred to BPAS.
