Request under Freedom of Information Act 2000

Thank you for your request for information which we received on Wednesday 18 June 2025. I am pleased to confirm the following.

I am writing to ask for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000. I want to request the current antibiotic guidelines used within your Trust for orthopaedic patients undergoing treatment for:

- 1. Open fractures
- 2. Closed trauma
- 3. *Elective orthopaedic surgery* (e.g., joint replacement, planned internal fixation)

For each category, please provide the following:

Open Fractures

- *First-line antibiotic(s)*
- Second-line antibiotic(s) (e.g., for penicillin allergy or other contraindications)
- Number of doses and dosing schedule (e.g., once, 8-hourly for 24 hours, etc.)

Closed Trauma Surgery

- First-line antibiotic(s)
- Second-line antibiotic(s)
- Number of doses and dosing schedule

Elective Orthopaedic Surgery

- *First-line prophylactic antibiotic(s)*
- Second-line options (for allergy/MRSA risk)
- Number of doses and timing (e.g., single dose at induction, repeat dose if surgery >2 hours, etc.)
