



## Request under Freedom of Information Act 2000

Thank you for your request for information which we received on 26 April 2019.

I am pleased to confirm the following.

I am writing to you to request information around the financial benefits to the trust or to UKPC in patrolling the parking system at MKUH.

Specifically I am interested in the monetary value gained by the trust and UKPC through parking fines at MKUH, the total amount of parking paid per month through staff parking and the amount that MKUH pays UKPC for their services.

Monetary gains through enforcement charges to the Trust are nil and the Trust does not have access to UKPC figures.

Staff parking charges through salary brings in approximately £540,000 per annum.

The Trust does not pay UKPC for their services.
