Thank you for your request for information which we received on 05 May 2022.

I am pleased to confirm the following.

1. The amount of money paid to the trust by Sensyne Health as part of the data-sharing agreement between the two organisations. Please break down per year since the agreement between the two organisations was made.

2.If possible, please break down the amounts by investment from Sensyne to the trust to enable the curation and analysis of the data, and by royalty on revenues generated by Sensyne from the research in which the data has been used (if applicable).

Please break down per year since the agreement between the two organisations was made. 4. The state of the data provided to Sensyne Health in terms of patient identification – ie, is this data fully anonymised (re-identification impossible), pseudonymised (re-identification possible) or other?

The Trust goes to a great deal of trouble to make sure that Sensyne are completely unable to identify any individual patients. This extends to ensuring that, for example, postcode is withheld or abbreviated with small data trials. If there is any doubt, the data set would be deleted immediately. The Trust believes that the IG framework between us is very robust.
