



Request under Freedom of Information Act 2000

Thank you for your request for information which we received on 21 May 2019.

Prior to the new guidance of July 2018 we already had the relevant MDT in place, but we have ensured that attendance from all clinicians and recording of decisions are more robust

We have never used vaginally inserted mesh in the management of vaginal prolapse.

Whilst clinicians are fully trained to do so, we have not reintroduced suburethral vaginal tapes since April 2019, due to the lack of a substantive Urogynaecologist We have a recognised Urogynaecologist who can undertake Colposuspensions where recommended by the MDT and agreed by the patient

We have not changed our processes or advice to patients since the April 2019 revised guidance, and continue to offer Colposuspension only for stress incontinence.
