Thank you for your request for information which we received on 03 February 2020.

I am pleased to confirm the following.

1. The type of any wrong route medication administration never events in the last three years e.g. Intravenous medication given intrathecally.

1-2018 - A patient was given oral solution Methadone in a syringe driver instead of the injectable solution

2. The hospital and department the error took place.

3. The severity of the harm caused by the error.

This was investigated as a serious incident. The patient did not suffer any ill-effects from having the oral solution of Methadone administered via the syringe driver instead of the injection solution, and his injection site was fine.
