4. What is the procedure for when a patient is diagnosed with Covid-19 outside a Covid-19 ward?	When a patient is diagnosed with Covid outside 'a Covid Ward', the infection control team is involved and the patient is moved to either a Covid Ward or a side room on the current ward. Other patients in the proximity of such a case are identified and an assessment made (although beds are spaced 2m apart to minimise risk of cross infection). Staff members in the area wear appropriate PPE (extant guidelines) at all times. This procedure has remained the same throughout the pandemic to date.							
4a) Has this procedure remained the same throughout the time period set out above?								
5. What is the procedure for when a member of staff is diagnosed with Covid-19?	When a member of staff is diagnosed with Covid they are instructed to self-isolate at home for ten days. In addition to conventional contact tracing outside the hospital, staff health and well-being - in conjunction with infection prevention and control - will make an assessment of workplace contacts. Staff members wear appropriate PPE (extant guidelines) for their role at all times. Social distancing is encouraged across the hospital site. There have been no staff cases in recent weeks whilst the national 'test and trace' system has been up and running.
