



## Request under Freedom of Information Act 2000

Thank you for your request for information which we received on 22 April 2021.

I am pleased to confirm the following.

## 1. How many patients have been treated for severe asthma (ICD10 code J45.5) in the last three months?

- Total patients 1 Patient
- Patients aged 6-11 years 0 Patients
- Patients aged 12-17 years 0 Patients
- Patients aged 18 years and above 1 Patient

Please note: We are unable to identify if the patient was specifically treated for severe asthma, only that they had the above ICD10 code coded to their inpatient admission as a primary diagnosis. Also, having discussed this with our clinical coding team, the code J455 is an American ICD10 code and is not used in the UK. Therefore, we have used the ICD10 code J46X, which is the code we use for severe asthma.

## 3. How many patients have been treated (for any condition) in the last three months with:

- Benralizumab 0 We do not use this drug
- Omalizumab 0 We do not use this drug
- Reslizumab 0 We do not use this drug
- Mepolizumab 0 We do not use this drug
- 4. How many patients have been treated in the last three months for asthma ONLY with:
  - Dupilumab 0 We do not treat asthma with these drugs
  - Upadacitinib 0 We do not treat asthma with these drugs
